



## A CRAFT-BEVERAGE GUIDE TO EVERETT



Love craft beer? You're in the right place. Everett has a stellar suds scene. Here are the spots the locals love. Oh, and this may take you a couple of days to get through. Pace yourself.

First, draw straws to see who's going to be your DD or plan your method of transportation (walk, Lyft, etc.), because drinking and driving is dumb and illegal. The first stop on our list is **1. SCUTTLEBUTT BREWING**, a classic family-friendly brewpub on the waterfront. Try their rotating seasonal offerings and the fish & chips.

Take a short walk south of Toggle's and wander into **2. AT LARGE BREWING**. Here, you'll find a large selection of IPAs in a great location with an open floor plan. It's especially lovely on summer afternoons when they open the water-facing garage door. Sometimes they have food trucks, check their Facebook page for details.

Head down the street a bit to **3. BREWS ALMIGHTY**, a neighborhood taproom with a funny name. Don't expect any food, but do expect some rare beers on tap and in bottles. It's also a great spot to watch a game.

Make your way up the road to the **4. INDEPENDENT BEER BAR**, a dog-friendly, beer-lover's haven. One glance at the tap list and you'll know the owners are really into beer. You can get food delivered to your table via local restaurants or sample the Independent's Russian-style dumplings—the perfect accompaniment to a pint or two.

Next, leave downtown, head about 10 minutes down I-5 to Everett Mall Way and hit up **5. LAZY BOY BREWING** (715 100th St. SE), **6. MIDDLETON BREWING** (607 SE Everett Mall Way, Ste. 27-A) and **7. CRUCIBLE BREWING** (909 SE Everett Mall Way). These three breweries are all within a couple minutes of each other and all offer outstanding, one-of-a-kind beers (try Middleton's Fruity Pebbles breakfast cereal beer).

### MORE POPULAR SPOTS

**BLUEWATER DISTILLING**. Great cocktails and food, located next to Scuttlebutt at 1205 Craftsman Way. **THE SNO-ISLE FOOD CO-OP**. Another great place to pick up a six-pack from craft breweries, and their deli sandwiches are legit. 2804 Grand Ave. **AESIR MEADERY**. Run by a local guy who makes old-style honey wine that's the bee's knees. It's located in an alley and can be tricky to find. 2625 Colby Ave. We recommend calling before you visit 425.495.6201.
